“A bird-friendly garden is a nature-friendly garden.

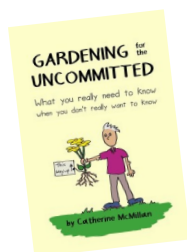
As well as food think about habitat too. Water for drinking and washing in is a must. Trees, hedges, vigorous climbers and large shrubs provide places to perch and to nest.

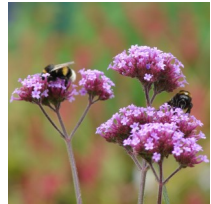
